Dear Parents and Community Members:

We are pleased to present you with the Annual Education Report (AER), which provides key information on the 2024-25 educational progress for Michigan Online School. The AER addresses the complex reporting information required by federal and state laws. The school's report contains information about accountability, student assessment, and teacher quality. For the 2025-26 school year, schools were identified based on previous years' performance using definitions and labels as required in the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). A Targeted Support and Improvement (TSI) school is one that had at least one underperforming student group in 2024-25. An Additional Targeted Support (ATS) school is one that had at least one student group performing at the same level as the lowest 5% of all schools in the state in 2021-22. A Comprehensive Support and Improvement (CSI) school is one whose performance was in the lowest 5% of all schools in the state, had a graduation rate at or below 67%, failed to exit CSI status in 2024-25, or failed to exit ATS status in 2021-22. Some schools are not identified with any of these labels. In these cases, no status label is given.

Our school was identified for: Comprehensive Support and Improvement due to our graduation rate being below the 67% threshold.

Michigan Online School (MOS) opened in the winter of 2017. In 2020, MOS changed its programming by directly hiring all its own staff and teachers, partnered with a new management company, and began using new learning management and student information systems. Student enrollment and staff growth have continued to increase each year of the school's operation.

Michigan Online School employed some key academic initiatives to help students. MOS hired interventionists in math and reading and lowered student to teacher ratios in math and English to support students' learning. Students in grades K-11 participated in diagnostic and benchmark testing using iReady and IXL to measure academic growth of students. Staff began building short cycle assessments and focusing on essential standards for intervention. Teachers worked with instructional coaches and participated in professional learning focused on strong, evidence-based instruction. MOS increased the number of students who were dually enrolled and those taking advanced placement courses. MOS also expanded its continuum of services for students with disabilities by adding both a cognitive impairment program, and resource support. The Board approved the addition of the Core Academy Program to support students who were credit deficient in graduating.

New staff positions have been added to support students holistically and strategically including an Attendance Support Specialist, School Social Workers, a multi-tiered system of support (MTSS) Coordinator to frame and launch a system to better address behavioral, social-emotional, and academic needs of students, and a data analyst to make data actionable for school teams. Lowering the student to Success Coach ratio saw MOS hire additional coaches to work with students and their families on being successful in online schooling.

Michigan Online School's Continuous Improvement Plan (CIP) includes a large team of staff members who work with one main goal of raising our graduation rate by implementing MTSS and data-driven practices. As we have monitored our CIP, we have adjusted our activities according to our data and needs. Our current activities include attendance, engagement, math, co-teaching, and MTSS. Each of those activities is worked on by a subcommittee using interim and annual goals. The CIP team continues to implement, monitor, and adjust to address the needs of our school and our students.

PROCESS FOR ASSIGNING PUPILS TO THE SCHOOL

Michigan Online School serves full-time students in grades K-12 who meet the requirements of the policy and who are residents of the state of Michigan. MOS does not charge tuition and does not discriminate in its pupil admissions policies or practices based on intellectual or athletic ability, measures of achievement or aptitude, status as a student with a disability, or any other basis that would be illegal if used by a school district.

An open enrollment period will be held annually using the procedure outlined below. The deadline for accepting applications will be clearly stated on the enrollment section of the school website and at all information sessions and publications regarding enrollment for the school.

On an annual basis, MOS will determine its maximum capacity for student enrollment in the K-12 program. For 2023-2024, enrollment was capped at 1150 students and for 2024-2025 enrollment was capped at 1367 students with grade level caps implemented.

To apply for enrollment in MOS during the open enrollment period, parents must complete the online application on the MOS website <http://www.michiganonlineschool.com/> indicating the names, birthdates, and grades of all students they wish to enroll in the school for the following school year.

Applications will be reviewed for age eligibility. During the enrollment process, age eligibility will be verified by requiring a certified copy or original of the student's birth certificate before a student's enrollment is complete.

Michigan Online School's Improvement Plan follows a process of reviewing and analyzing data, creating and managing goals, defining strategies to accomplish the goals, and monitoring and evaluating our progress. Michigan Online School uses the Michigan Continuous Improvement Plan (MICIP). The Continuous Improvement Plan goal is Michigan Online School will utilize the continuous improvement process to examine data to drive decision making using academic, non-academic, and systems data to analyze, evaluate, and plan strategies to improve outcomes for each student; leading to an increase in graduation rate of at least 67% by June 2026 as measured by MI School Data. The 2023-2024 evidence-based strategies the school is using to meet this goal are: co-teaching, iReady benchmark assessments, learning readiness (orientation), multi-tiered system of supports (MTSS), targeted tier II and tier III interventions, and IXL. The continuous improvement team met 8 times (monthly) in 2023-2024 to implement, monitor, and adjust the plan. Our activities in 2024-2025 include attendance and engagement, co-teaching, MTSS, Targeted Tier II and Tier III interventions, and the English Learner (EL) program. The CIP team met monthly in 2024-2025, a total of 9 times.

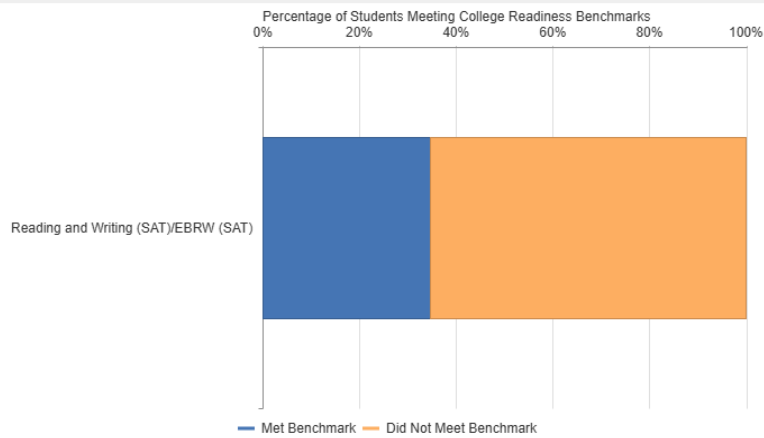

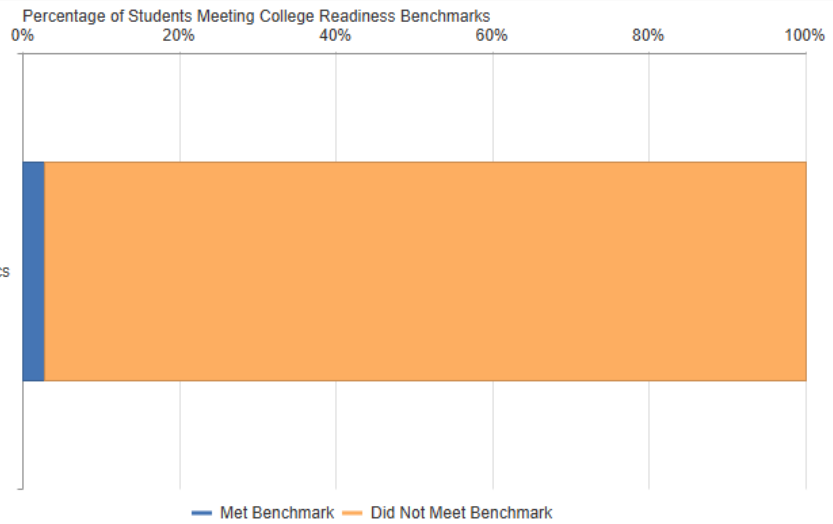

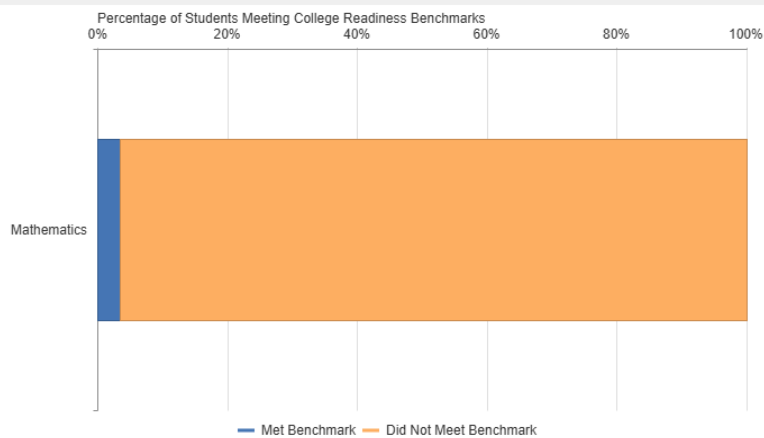

IDENTIFY THE NUMBER AND PERCENT OF STUDENTS REPRESENTED BY PARENTS AT PARENT-TEACHER CONFERENCES

In our model, parents interact on a consistent basis with teachers as we have a collaborative partnership to ensure student success. Communications between teachers, students and parents take place daily and include chat, email, instant messages, in person meetings, video conferences, phone calls and text messages. Parents are invited to formal Parent Teacher Conferences in fall and spring of each year. For the school years 2023-2024 and 2024-2025, parent teacher conference attendance was:

THE NUMBER AND PERCENT OF POSTSECONDARY ENROLLMENTS (DUAL ENROLLMENT)

In 2023-2024, 1 student, or .1% of all high school students were dually enrolled. In 2024-2025, 3 students, or .4% of all high school students were enrolled in 7 dual enrollment courses.

THE NUMBER OF COLLEGE EQUIVALENT COURSES OFFERED (AP/IB)

In 2023-2024, Michigan Online School offered 8 AP courses including AP Language and Composition, AP English Literature, AP Environmental Science, AP Statistics, AP US World History, and AP World History, AP Biology, and AP Calculus. In 2024-2025, 8 AP courses were offered including AP Language and Composition, AP English Literature, AP Environmental Science, AP Statistics, AP US World History, and AP World History, AP Biology, and AP Calculus.

THE NUMBER AND PERCENTAGE OF STUDENTS ENROLLED IN COLLEGE EQUIVALENT COURSES (AP/IB)

In 2023-2024 there were 23 students, or 3.21% of our total high school enrollment enrolled in AP courses. In 2024-2025, 16 students, or 2.27% of our total high school enrollment enrolled in AP courses.

THE NUMBER AND PERCENTAGE OF STUDENTS RECEIVING A SCORE LEADING TO COLLEGE CREDIT

In 2023-2024, 3 students took 5 AP exams, and scores receiving college credit were earned on 4 of the AP exams. In 2024-2025, 1 student took an AP exam but did not earn a score that would receive college credit.

In 2024-2025 we achieved a 10% gain in our 4-year graduation rate! We hope you will celebrate with us, but I want to encourage you to take on the challenge of working collaboratively with everyone at Michigan Online School to support our continuous improvement. There is more work to do. We look forward to the continued academic growth of our students and to improving our engagement and attendance, our participation rates in state testing, as well as increased proficiency. The mission of Michigan Online School is to deliver a high-quality, technology-based education that provides the skills and knowledge students need for success. Our students are at the center of every decision we make.
